Cemal Kafadar received his PhD from the McGill University Institute of Islamic Studies in 1987 and taught for two years in Princeton's Near Eastern Studies department before going to Harvard. His interests include the social and cultural aspects of Middle East and Balkan history in the late medieval and early modern era. He teaches courses on Ottoman history and historiography, urban space, and popular culture as well as history and cinema.

In 2010, Professor Kafadar received Turkey's Presidential Grand Award in Culture and Arts. He is a member of the Editorial Committee of *Historians of the Ottoman Empire*.

His publications include *Between Two Worlds: The Construction of the Ottoman State* (1995); *Suleyman the Second and His Time*, edited with Halil Inalcik (1993); "How Dark is the History of the Night, How Black the Story of Coffee, How Bitter the Tale of Love: The Changing Measure of Leisure and Pleasure in Early Modern Istanbul," in A. Öztürkmen and E. B. Vitz (eds), *Medieval and Early Modern Performance in the Eastern Mediterranean* (2004); "Evliya Çelebi in Dalmatia: An Ottoman Traveler's Encounters with the Franks," in Alina Payne (ed.), *Dalmatia and the Mediterranean* (2014); and, book in Turkish, *Kendine Ait Bir Roma* (2017).
